

Call for applications for the *Paul Martini Early Career Award for Clinical Research 2025*

The Paul Martini Foundation is calling for applications in Germany for the *Paul Martini Early Career Award for Clinical Research* (former *Paul Martini Young Talent Award for Clinical Research*) for the year 2025.

The prize honours up to three scientists up to the age of 35 for outstanding achievements in the field of clinical research on drug therapy and clinical pharmacology. The award is endowed with EUR 6,000 each. On application, family leaves and comparable special circumstances can be considered for an extension of the age limit – if needed.

Measurable successes (including publications) in clinical research on drug therapy and clinical pharmacology, as well as the innovative character and patient benefit are assessed. Objective results that contribute to advancing the success of clinical research in Germany are therefore considered in the selection process.

The closing date for entries is Friday, **August 15th, 2025**.

A three-member jury chaired by Professor Stefan Endres, Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität München, will select up to three prize winners. The *Paul Martini Early Career Award for Clinical Research* will be presented at the Paul Martini Foundation's annual autumn symposium on Friday, November 7th, 2025, in Berlin.

The prize is donated in memory of the well-known scientist and physician Professor [Paul Martini](#) (Bonn) in recognition of his special services to the promotion and further development of clinical-therapeutic research, which he has significantly shaped over decades with his 1932 publication *Methodology of Therapeutic Investigation*.

The work to be submitted should present objectifiable results or successes in abstract format (background - methods - results - discussion - summary; max. 500 words). In the case of (up to two) submitted publications, these should have been published or accepted for publication as first or last authorship within the current or last two years.

Include the following attachments with the letter of application (with the title of the project or work and address):

- Abstract and one or two related publications
- CV of the applicant (with professional position and activity, no photo)
- List of publications for the current and last three years
